Subject: -Grant of Conditional Permission Hanuman Shikshan Prasarak Mandal's Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Tal-Hatkanangale, Dist. Kolhapur, Islampur-416112, Maharashtra (Inst. ID. AYU0158) for 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder-reg.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made there under shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made there under. Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM Act, 2020 shall not be applicable.

- Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Hanuman Shikshan Prasarak Mandal's Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Tal-Hatkanangale, Dist. Kolhapur, Islampur-416112, Maharashtra (Inst. ID. AYU0158)** inspection of your College was conducted on **26.02.2024 & 27.02.2024 on Hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and rating Board, NCISM to process the **Conditional Permission for 60 seats in UG (BAMS) under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2024-25.**
- Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. **On careful examination of the assessment report following shortcoming/defect have been observed-**

a) **Availability of Non-teaching staff is** $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{23}{25} \times 100\% = 92\%$ **which is not fulfilling the criteria as per Schedule-VI of MSR 2016.**

Shortcoming is as under:-

- As per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), the assessment report was placed in the **90th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **17.05.2024**. **Board concluded that the college is not fulfilling the notified & approved criteria, but fulfilling the criteria required for issuance of permission as per the Regulation 3 of MSR 2016 and as per the note mentioned in Schedule-VI of MSR 2016. Hence, Board decided to issue the conditional permission for 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2024-25.**
- Therefore, **Conditional Permission is issued to Hanuman Shikshan Prasarak Mandal's Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Tal-Hatkanangale, Dist. Kolhapur, Islampur-416112, Maharashtra (Inst. ID. AYU0158) for 60 seats in UG (BAMS) under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2024-25**

subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcoming shall be fulfilled along with the following requirements: -

- I. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the **permitted intake capacity of 60 seats** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2024-25 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder..**
5. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
6. Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
7. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
8. **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2024 and compliance report should be sent to get permission for the academic session 2025-2026:**
 - i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto.
 - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
 - iv) The shortcoming mentioned in Para no. 2 above, should be fulfilled.
9. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2025-26.
